

Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year!!!

Plans for REUNION 2023 in Providence, RI in May have been slow in developing as many of you are aware! The biggest issues have been rising food prices and "yoyo" fuel costs. We FINALLY got our tours under contract this past week and the Registration Form and tours info is soon to be posted on the Association website and are included in this newsletter!

Our host hotel for Reunion 2023 is the Crowne Plaza at 801 Greenwich Avenue in Warwick, RI 02886. Our room block is for rooms with either 2 queen beds or 1 king bed at \$129 + tax (currently 13%) and includes a buffet breakfast in the hospitality room! They also have handicap accessible rooms (at the same price), but you will have to make that reservation by phone. Specify which you want and verify the room rate when you make your reservation. Reservations can be made by dialing 401-732-6000 and asking for a room in the "USS Mullinnix DD944 Reunion 2023 group room block". The group code is "MUL". If you prefer to make your reservation online, simply go to the Association website and use the link posted there. The group room rate applies for + or - 3 days if you want to come early or stay longer. All reservations must be made before Monday, April 3rd. Late reservations will be on a space available basis at prevailing rates. Amenities include a refrigerator in each room, complimentary WIFI, free shuttle service to/from the Warwick T.F. Green Airport and free parking. Call the hotel front desk at 401-732-6000 on arrival at the airport to arrange your shuttle transportation to the hotel. Book early to get a better choice of room! If you need to cancel your reservation, do that at least 24 hours before 3 PM on day of scheduled arrival to avoid being charged for the first night as a "no-show"! Please call or text Bob to let him know you had to cancel at 302-650-3042 or email him at muxassn@hotmail.com. We may be able to save you some \$\$\$. Someone else may want your tour seat and it may not be too late to save you the cost of a meal or two! We can't help if you don't contact him! If for any reason you have difficulty accessing the info on the website, please just email or call Bob and we will be happy to mail you what you need!

The tour company we are using is Experience RI Tours. They are family owned and operated and we met the 2 brothers that operate their coaches and narrate the tours. We took the Newport tour with them in 2019. It is terrific! Their coaches have 25 or 29 seats so the tours are up close and personal. They also do some great tours in Providence every Saturday. Do yourself a favor and research their website at experienceri.com to book yourself a tour for a super way to enjoy free time on Saturday during the reunion!! How about their Discover Providence or maybe Taste of Rhode Island tour? If you do book yourself a tour, please let Bob know by email so he can track numbers. If enough of us do book the same tour, they will pick us all up at the Crowne Plaza instead of their downtown location.

Thursday, May 4th...

Come away with us for a whale of a time in the city that once lit the world! Today, the #1 fishing port in America, New Bedford has a rich history. On this trip you will explore a fascinating military museum, learn about the commercial fishing industry, and discover this unique town that was the setting of the famous novel, Moby Dick, and was once the wealthiest city in America. Tour is 9 AM to 5 PM with pick up at and return to the Crowne Plaza hotel in Warwick, RI. We will visit Fort Taber Military Museum 9:45-11:00 am, New Bedford Fishing Heritage Center 11:15am - 12:30pm, enjoy lunch at The Black Whale 12:45 - 2:00pm, tour the port of New Bedford + Seamen's Bethel + Ben Franklin Five and Dime 2:00 -3:00pm and then the New Bedford Whaling Museum 3:00 - 4:15pm. Tour cost is \$60 and includes all admission prices and transportation with lunch on your own. This price requires a minimum of 20 participants and is limited to the first 29 to sign up. Some walking on uneven ground and cobblestone streets will be required.

Story From Arlington National Cemetery



"Wreaths Across America" started with the vision of one person, Morrill Worcester, owner of the Worcester Wreath Company in Harrington, Maine. As a child, Morrill and his family made a trip to Washington, DC

and one of the places he visited was Arlington National Cemetery. The impact of that visit stayed with him his whole life. He believed his success was in part due to the sacrifices made by the veterans resting at Arlington. In 1992, the Worcester Wreath Company had a surplus of wreaths towards the end of the holiday season, so Morrill worked with Maine Senator Olympia Snow to bring those wreaths down to Arlington to the older and less visited sections of the cemetery as a way to remember the veterans resting in those sections. As this project was coming together, others offered to lend support. A local trucking company volunteered to drive the wreaths to Virginia, members of the local VFW and American Legion posts in Harrington volunteered to decorate each wreath with a handtied red bow. The Maine State Society in DC volunteered to lay the wreaths at Arlington. In 2007, this seedling project officially became "Wreaths Across America" (WAA). The 501(c)(3) organization grew from 60,000 volunteers laying over 100,000 wreaths in 300 cemeteries located in the 50 US states, Puerto Rico and 24 overseas in 2008 to two million volunteers laying 2.4 million wreaths in 3,137 participating locations in 2021. 250,000 of those wreaths were laid at Arlington by 38,000 volunteers. Over 525 volunteer trucks now deliver the wreaths across the country. The "Wreaths Across America" mission is simple and very important - "Remember. Honor. Teach." While the wreath laying is the central event of the WAA, the organization conducts various programs throughout the year honoring our veterans and teaching younger generations about the importance of honoring those who have made our freedom possible. Wreath laying is now an annual event that occurs on either the 2nd or 3rd Saturday of December. This year's wreath laying at Arlington National Cemetery will happen on Saturday, December 17th.
